

Placement Procedures for First-Year Composition

There are three routes a student might take to complete his/her First-Year Composition requirement:

1. **Regular Sequence:** English 101 in the fall and 102 in the spring; (students may not take 102 before passing 101)
2. **Intensive Sequence:** English 101 with 103 (Writing Workshop, 1 credit hour) in the Fall and 102 with 104 (Writing Workshop II, 1 credit hour) in the Spring;
3. **The Honors Sequence:** English 118 in the fall and (if students make an A, B+, or B) a sophomore-level course in the English Department or English 355 in the spring (students who receive a passing grade below B in 118 will need to take 102 in the spring).

At or below 18 English and 18 Composite	→	At or below 450 Verbal and 850 Composite	→	English 101 and 103
Between 18 & 29 English & Composite	→	Verbal between 450 and 680 and Composite between 850 and 1280	→	English 101 (Strongly recommend 103 for students who want or may need extra help)
At or above 29 English and Composite	→	At or above 680 Verbal 1280 Composite	→	*English 118 (Offered only in the Fall)

- * Honors Scholars, regardless of scores, should register for 118 during orientation.
- * AP Credit: A 4 or 5 on the College Board Advanced Placement Test in Literature and Composition will give a student credit for **both** English 101 and 102. A 4 or 5 on the Language and Composition exam will give credit for English 101 **only**.
