As the Assistant Director of Composition, my usual responsibilities included weekly meetings with the director and associate director; support meetings with graduate student instructors; assisting with Composition Office grant applications; and troubleshooting instructor issues with curriculum, students, and technology. In addition, I was the point person for implementing our revision of English 101, which included developing template materials (such as a syllabus, a course calendar, and assignment sheets), designing a Canvas course shell, co-facilitating teaching workshops, and curating a repository of sample lesson plans for first-time instructors.
